This week's selections of new art shows are all solo exhibitions. In addition, there are two fundraisers that shouldn't be missed—especially for those who enjoy the energy of collaboration and unusual forms as basis for artwork.

On Saturday, Exquisite Corpse.2 presents a fundraiser where the main draw is surfboards made into art and created Surrealism style. It's being held at Neoteric Fine Art. On Wednesday, the Box Art Auction Preview Event offers the first look at creative rectangular objects made for charity.

### **"RAMIRO, SOLO SHOW" - Grenning Gallery**

Angel Ramiro Sanchez is one of the art stars in the Grenning Gallery. His paintings adhere to academic classical realism but then expand to include his joy of adhering paint.

For this year's annual solo show in Sag Harbor, Ramiro presents paintings that continue his studio interior themes. However, these works seem to invite viewers to become part of the scene through questions and conversation that seem to lie in wait through implication in the painting's composition.

Ramiro's art is held in public and private collections in Europe, England, the United States and Venezuela. He was recently given a retrospective by the Minister of Culture in Milan, Italy. In 2013, he will present a show of religious painting in Rome, sponsored by the Vatican.

### **"METAMORPHOSIS OF MOOD" - A solo show by Andrea Kowch - Richard J. Demato Fine Arts Gallery**

This is the third annual solo show for Kowch held at the Richard J. Demato Fine Arts Gallery. The Midwestern artist has captured Hamptons imaginations with her haunting scenes and gothic-like characters who inhabit Andrew Wyeth-like landscapes with an Alfred Hitchcock twist.

This year's exhibition takes over both floors of the gallery. New paintings made within the last 12 months will be presented. So will some of her limited edition prints. "Metamorphosis of Mood" will unveil Kowch's largest painting to date.

### **"NEW WORK BY DAN RIZZIE" - Peter Marcelle Gallery**

Rizzie's work combines the colors and textures of faraway deserts with implied lush naturals, intriguing shapes and whimsical circles to make his art.

Rizzie's work is held by permanent collections of multiple museums including the Museum of Modern Art and the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City.

**“EXQUISITE CORPSE.2: THE SURFBOARD AS BODY”** fundraiser presents surfboards as basis for art. Each surfboard features three separate sections of art made by different artists stacked into a single artwork. Each artist made their work blind to how it would link with others. All of the participating artists are also surfers.

The surfboards are currently on view at Neoteric Fine Art. Bids for the silent auction will be accepted until 10 p.m. on Saturday. The fundraiser culminates with an Event Night on Saturday held from 6 to 10 p.m. The show is curated by Mike Solomon.
