The Funny Pages - Walt Handelsman

It's difficult not to be in awe of Walt Handelsman. He's the most widely reprinted cartoonist in America. He's won every major journalism award for cartooning excellence. He's won The Pulitzer Prize twice for editorial cartoons. He was the first person to win the Pulitzer Prize for animation in 2007, after teaching himself Flash the year before.*

He's been a featured guest on CNN, FOX and ABC's "Nightline." And if that weren't enough, rumor has it he's an entertaining and engaging speaker that draws laughs while bringing the art of editorial cartooning to life. He's been on staff at *Newsday* since 2001.

As far as the cartoons go, they are a diverse bunch and range from the heart pulling to the heartbreaking. Handelsman's work creates likely scenarios that could unfold stemming from politics, pop culture and current events, revealing the human side of the day's headlines.

Walt Handelsman is a two-time Pulitzer Prize-winning editorial cartoonist. His work is nationally syndicated is published over 250 newspapers around the country and internationally. They include *Newsweek, USA Today, The New York Times, The Washington Post* and the *Chicago Tribune*. Handelsman is on staff at Newsday.

His awards include two National Headliner Awards, the Society of Professional Journalists Award, the Robert F. Kennedy Journalism Award, The Scripps Howard National Journalism Award and The 2007 Online News Association's Best Online Commentary Award for his animations.

Handelsman has authored seven collections of his editorial cartoons and a children's book. He lives in Nassau County, Long Island.
