This weekend presents an unusual array of options for art in the Hamptons including a conceptual music performance, a Pollock-Krasner docents exhibition, a solo self-portrait exhibition revealing an artwork-a-day project celebrating the artist's 50th birthday and a documentary film screening revealing young farmers on the East End. AMAGANSETT

The weekend only show opens on Saturday morning and remains on view through Sunday at 3 p.m.

LONGHOUSE RESERVE - Discussion and screening the documentary "Growing Farmers" takes place on Saturday at 4 p.m. and provides a Spring sneak peek at LongHouse Reserve's new season. LongHouse opens at 2 p.m. on Saturday. The documentary was produced by Hilary Leff, the vice chair of the Peconic Land Trust and was directed by Michael Halsband.
