ROGERS MANSION - “Extraordinarily Ordinarily! Photographs by Mallory Samson,” “Southampton Landscapes: Paintings by Pat Garrity,” and “Historic Landmarks of Southampton: Paintings by Kevin O’Malley” opens on Tuesday (May 14). All three shows remain on view through August 3. An opening reception will be held on June 15 from 4 to 6 p.m.

Samson will exhibit about 150 photographs taken of antique objects from the Southampton Historical Museum’s collection.
