Critic's Picks: Abstraction Strong at artMRKT 2013

I was pleasantly surprised by artMKRT Hamptons 2013. Normally, art fairs feel like carnivals, especially on the East End. They stand in so much contrast to the surroundings here—the sublimity of our mostly natural world with its amazing light. Jam packed with shiny babbles that distract but usually offer no real value, I have sometimes felt like taking a shower after attending some art fair editions in the past.

This fair had a very different vibe. It was organized wisely and the spaces let you breathe a little. Most importantly, the majority of booths actually had something real to offer. I was also intrigued that the strongest works were abstract paintings, collages and photos. It was if this fair was an antidote to my previous art fair experiences or to other venues where bombast still rules.

Those few booths in artMRKT Hamptons that still displayed bombast, where pop culture and its explicit content aims to instantly gratify a largely frivolous audience, fell very flat as if they didn't know that ship had sailed. The subtle dignity of the serious abstract art in this fair showed that perhaps we are entering into a post post-modern age in which there is a lot of soul searching going on and artists are returning to forms and ideas that have survived and lasted through all the sturm und drang of the era of bombast. They are taking those tested values and forms and moving ahead with them, as a kind reformation.

It feels like a return to earth and the vibe of this new art is very akin to the new farm movement out here. (Check out the film *Growing Farmers*). There seems to be a generational return, a grass roots return, to progressing old values into our time among a new generation. All the glitter, plastic and frills are no match for rich soil and organic growth: in art, in farming and in the search for deeper cultural values.
