“In exploring my sense of place on the East End, I bring the two places together in landscapes, and mindscapes,” states Benfield.

The Ashawagh Hall exhibition will showcase her interpretations of local landscapes and seasonal still lifes. This will be Kirsten’s first time exhibiting with other local artists.

Jerry Schwabe is a painter, photographer and sculptor. He has studied at various schools, including the National Academy of Fine Arts, New School University, School of Visual Arts, the Art Students League, and the Golden Eagle. His award-winning work has been displayed at many solo and group shows.

The Ashawagh Hall exhibition for the first time features Schwabe's photography. Paintings will also be on view.

Jerry Schwabe paints for "the eyes and the soul" and his soft muted colors in many of his beach scenes reflect a sense of calmness and serenity. Contrastingly, many of his new paintings are full of vibrant bursts of unexpected color pairings.

Richard Udice grew up on the Rockefeller Estate in Pocantico Hills. While living on the estate, he was surrounded by an incredible art collection which had a definite impact on his entire life. He has always made time to paint even while teaching school in Westchester, NY.

Favoring landscapes painted in oils, Udice's style and techniques have evolved over the past few years since becoming a full time resident of East Hampton, NY. His work tends to focus on the impact of the unique lighting found here on the east end of Long Island.
