

## **LA Art Book Fair Underway**

**LOS ANGELES, CA-**The second edition of the LA Art Book Fair is currently underway and continues through tomorrow. The book fair unexpectantly took LA by storm last year with its inaugural edition and drew 15,000 people through its doors. Around 5,000 were originally expected based on MOCA predictions, said L.A. Art Book Fair curator Shannon Michael Cane, according to the <u>Los Angeles Times</u>.

The LA Art Fair is presented by Printed Matter, who also produces the <u>NY ART BOOK FAIR</u>, held every fall in New York City. In 2013, around 27,000 people attended the NY Art Book Fair, according to Printed Matter.

This year's fair in LA opened with high hopes of returning crowds. Harper's Books of East Hampton, NY is exhibiting art and books at this year's fair. The art includes works by Elizabeth Huey and Doug Rickard. Huey's work is also the subject of a solo show presented at Harper's Books in East Hampton, NY.

The 2014 A Book Fair is presenting artists' books, art catalogs, monographs, periodicals, and zines published by over 250 international presses, booksellers, antiquarians, artists, and independent publishers. The fair includes special projects, talks, lectures, curated screenings, panels and performances.

Programs on Sunday include "Anyone Telling Anything is Telling That Thing" by Eve Fowler" from 2 to 3 p.m. Fowler has invited fellow artists and friends to read Gertrude Stein's "Many Many Women", which is 40,000 words strong. Readers include Math Bass, Mel Shimkowitz, Dylan Mira, Litia Perta, Lauren Fisher and others. The event is presetned by the Contemporary Artists' Books Conference.

Those in the Hamptons may be familiar with Fowler's work. She exhibited a series of photographs made with Bass at the Fireplace Project in 2011 in the exhibition named for their series *The Gloria Hole*.

The Gloria Hole was the first installment to greet viewers who walked in the front door of the East

Hampton gallery. The works were a pairing of evocative photographs conjuring narratives of queer desire, complicated by disconnection in an illicit and anonymous environment.

Also on tap for Sunday is "Artists Read Baldessari" from 1 to 3 p.m.

Artists and special guests will read from *More Than You Wanted to Know About John Baldessari* (eds. Meg Cranston and Hans Ulrich Obrist, JRP|Ringier), two new volumes from the publisher's complete Baldessari writings project.

The new volumes feature previously unpublished texts, notes to students, course handouts, texts on other artists and portions of Baldessari's notebooks. The volumes are an experiment in how a literary genre might encompass artists' writings, having them stand alone in a book without images, according to the publisher.

For the event (and volume launch), a marathon reading of passages from Baldessari's writings will take place. The recital is a nod to the artist's playful 1972 performance in which he sang Sol LeWitt's *Thirty-Five Statements on Conceptual Art* to the tune of popular songs.

In his introduction to this seminal performance, Baldessari said that his goal was to help these sentences "escape," and reach "a much wider audience", according to the volume publishers

The event is presented by <u>ForYourArt</u> on the occasion of the Contemporary Artists' Books Conference at Printed Matter's LA Art Book Fair.
