



Signs and a New York State Program Make the Parrish Easier to Find

The Parrish Art Museum just became easier to find. A new sign has been installed at its entrance with another one on its way for Route 27 (Montauk Highway).

The new entrance sign is aluminum with black powder coat finish and Aevenir typeface. The sign to come on Montauk Highway will be courtesy of New York State and it's Path Through History program.

Launched in 2012 by Governor Andrew Cuomo, Path Through History highlights historical and cultural sites throughout New York State.

A [website](#) provides the full list of around 500 sites divided into 11 regions and street signs to make it easy to find points of interest in the program.

On the East End, Path Through History sites include the Parrish Art Museum (Water Mill), Home Sweet Home Museum (East Hampton), Pollock-Krasner House and Study Center (East Hampton), Oyster Ponds Historic Society (Orient), Historic Greenport and the Long Island Railroad Terminal (Greenport), the Horton Point Lighthouse (Southold), Hallockville Museum Farm (Riverhead) and the Big Duck (Flanders).

Sites on Long Island include the Heckscher Museum of Art (Huntington), Long Island Museum (Stony Brook), Nassau County Museum of Art (Roslyn), Caumsett State Historic Park (Lloyd Harbor), Chelsea Mansion at Muttontown Preserve (East Norwich), Sagamore Hill National Historic Site (Oyster Bay), Sands Point Preserve (Sands Point) and others.

New York City sites include The High Line, the Apollo Theatre, the Frick Collection, the Cathedral of St. John the Divine, Coney Island, many art and history museums and more.
