HAMPTONS, NY-

Festivals abound this weekend with the kickoff of “Winterfest: Live on the Vine” on the North Fork and Riverhead, a “Meet the Beatles” Weekend at Bay Street Theatre, and the family culture festival Harborfrost in Sag Harbor Village. Film screening series continue and so do new art exhibition openings. Following is this week’s list of where to find art and culture on the East End...

EAST END - “WINTERFEST: LIVE ON THE VINE” begins tomorrow (Feb. 7) and continues through March 16. The live music festival features over 100 concerts held at multiple venues across the North Fork and Riverhead. The majority are held at wineries on the North Fork. Admission is \$20 per concert or with a “Festival Hopper” passes. Festival Day Pass is \$30, a Weekend Pass is \$50 and a Festival Pass is \$200. Music includes blues, soul, rock and country. EAST HAMPTON/SPRINGS

“The 10th Annual Free Winter Film: Aliyah” screens on Sunday at 4:30 p.m. Aliyah is directed by Elie Wajeman. (France, 2012. French with English subtitles. 90 minutes.) Admission is free. The screening is presented in partnership with the East Hampton Library.
