They include an exhibition of John Chamberlain's metal flake paintings, art inspired by Hurricane Sandy, the first of Julian Schnabel's four exhibitions, and a solo show of monochromatic abstract paintings.

EAST END

"ON AN EASTERN SHORE" - Outeast Gallery in Montauk. Closes April 27.

"JOHN CHAMBERLAIN: IT AIN'T CHEAP" at DAN FLAVIN ART INSTITUTE in Bridgehampton. Closes April 27.

The exhibition presents six of the artist's rarely exhibited metal paintings from 1965 and the 1965 sculpture "It Ain't Cheap." The works are from a series of 12-inch-square paintings that were presented at Leo Castelli Gallery in January 1965 in the solo exhibition "Paintings done in auto lacquer and metal flake on formica."
