Dueling festivals take place this weekend with Southampton Septemberfest and the Sag Harbor American Music Festival presenting free family-friendly programming throughout the weekend. On the art front, new exhibitions have opening receptions at Southampton Center, Ashawagh Hall and Gallery Crossing. Film screenings abound all weekend. Look to The Parrish Art Museum, Guild Hall, the Westhampton Beach Performing Arts Center and the Pollock-Krasner House and Study Center to check out the options. Also this week, Watermill Center unveils its first artist open rehearsal for its fall artist residency program.
