November is a strong one for art with a Hamptons connection in New York City. This month, solo exhibitions featuring Hamptons-connected artists include Roy Lichtenstein, Jack Ceglic, Ron Burkhardt and Donald "Drawbertson". A sprawling historic-contemporary exhibition curated by Eric Fischl features around seven artists with Hamptons ties continues this month. However, the largest cluster of work by Hamptons artists can be found at the [IFPDA Print Fair](#). Taking place from November 5 - 9, look for works by Fairfield Porter, Winslow Homer, April Gornik, Jennifer Bartlett, Mel Bochner, Barbara Kruger, Robert Motherwell, Larry Rivers and others.
