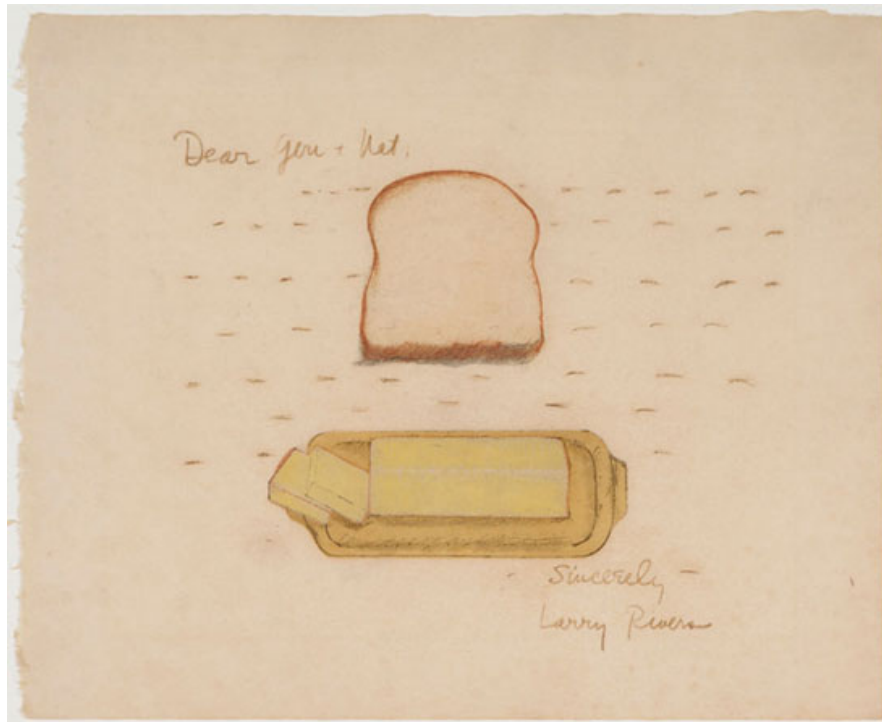
BRIDGEHAMPTON

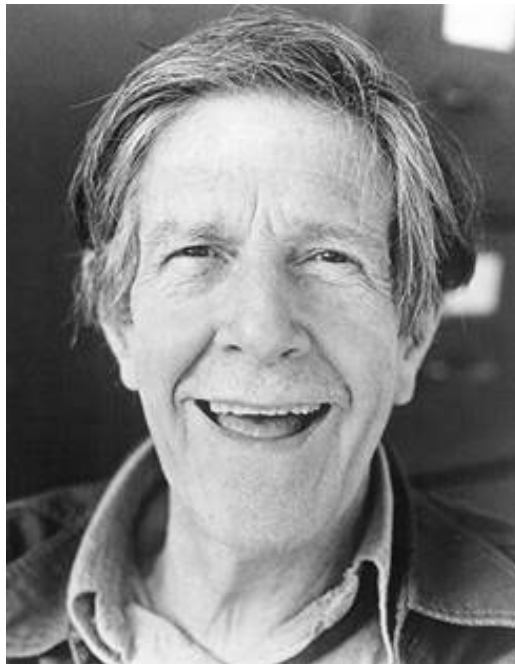
