The Norton Museum of Art's annual Gala on February 7, 2015 was a sold-out affair and honored art collector and philanthropist Beth Rudin DeWoody. The Gala also provided a first look at an exhibition featuring 200 works from DeWoody's expansive contemporary art collection. DeWoody is an avid supporter of the Norton and lives part-time in West Palm Beach. Her time is divided with New York, Los Angeles and Southampton, N.Y. Over 350 people turned out to celebrate DeWoody and the Norton at the Gala.

“The Triumph of Love: Beth Rudin DeWoody Collects” features a curated cross-section of 200 artworks from DeWoody’s 9,000-piece collection. It opened on February 8 and remains on view through May 3, 2015. Hamptons Art Hub will publish a story shortly revealing the exhibition and DeWoody’s talk with Norton Director Curatorial Affairs and Curator of Contemporary Art Cheryl Brutvan. The exhibition includes paintings, works on paper, sculpture and mixed media works. Museum goers get a taste of the exhibition inside with a “decked out” Airstream trailer transformed by artist Randy Palumbo that’s “parked” at the museum’s entrance. The piece was selected for inclusion in the show from DeWoody’s four decades of collecting contemporary art by Brutvan.
