



Classical and Jazz Concerts for Spring

Come and enjoy live classical and jazz music being performed on the East End. In the upcoming weeks there are five different series that will be presenting concerts spread throughout the Hamptons. They include the *Salon Series* at the Parrish Art Museum, *Spring Classical Concert Series* at the Montauk Library, the *Bridgehampton Chamber Music Festival*, a *Parlor Jazz Concert* at the Bridgehampton Museum, and *Rising Stars Piano Series* at the Southampton Cultural Center.

Salon Series Begins at the Parrish Art Museum

Friday, May 1, 6pm: Daria Rabotkina, Pianist, with the Wasmuth String Quartet

Concerts by young, award-winning classical musicians performing in an intimate setting will be featured in the Parrish Art Museum's Spring 2015 *Salon Series* on four consecutive Fridays beginning April 17 at 6pm. This is the Museum's fifth *Salon Series*, where performers offer insightful information about their program, and attendees have the opportunity to meet and socialize with the musicians.

Starting the Salon Series off on Friday, April 17, Tim Fain who plays a violin made by Francesco Gobetti, Venice will perform works by Ludwig Van Beethoven, Philip Glass, Felix Mendelssohn, Sergei Rachmaninoff, and Pablo de Sarasate at the Parrish. Pianist Tanya Gabrielian will accompany him. On Friday, April 24 the pianist Kimball Gallagher will be performing. He launched his international *88-Concert Tour* to revive salon culture through 88 performances in intimate venues. To date, he has played more than 300 concerts in 30 countries on the tour, which has raised nearly \$78,000 for charities.

Quartet on Friday, May 1. Her program at the Parrish will begin with solo piano works, and close with a work by Robert Schuman and the Wasmuth String Quartet. The Spring *Salon Series* comes to a close on May 8 with South Korean pianist Yoonie Han, whose program includes George Gershwin's *Rhapsody in Blue*, and piano arrangements of three Gershwin songs.

Tickets for *Salon Series*, which include Museum admission, are \$20; \$10 for Parrish Members.
