Guild Hall Summer Fashion Series On and Off the Runway: Lisa Perry & Cristina Cuomo

On **Sunday, July 19 at 11 a.m.** host and curator Pamela Fiori, former Editor-in-chief of Town & Country magazine, interviews designer Lisa Perry.

Lisa Perry was a vintage apparel collector well before she evolved into the renowned fashion designer that she is today. As a student at FIT, she became fixated on the styles of the 1960s and 1970s and began accumulating clothing and accessories in earnest. From Rudi Geinrich to Courreges, Perry amassed a treasure trove that is the inspiration for her own vivid designs (her boutique is on Main Street in East Hampton Village).

But it isn't only vintage fashion that has been an influence on Lisa Perry; it is also contemporary art. She and her husband Richard Perry are major collectors of many of the very same artists whose work has graced the galleries of Guild Hall: Roy Lichtenstein, Larry Rivers, Andy Warhol, Chuck Close, Jeff Koons and others. To prove the point, Perry will show some of her most art-inspired designs and explain how they came to be.
