There's plenty to see on the East End gallery scene these days. To help plan your weekend, here are three exhibitions in the Hamptons that should be on your list.

## “Selfies and Portraits of the East End” at Guild Hall

If you haven't seen “Selfies and Portraits of the East End”, now is the time to do it before it closes Sunday night. The exhibition presents a diverse overview of portraiture and self-portraiture in painting, photography, sculpture and mixed media made by East End artists.

A favorite was a series of photographs by Fischer Cherry. Each image is a reflection of the way females choose to portray themselves in “selfies”. Compositions are part staged and part impromptu. Another strong series were self-portraits by photographer Bastienne Schmidt. Culled from her “Home Stills” series, the images depict Schmidt in carefully selected locations that resonate with symbolism.

## **“Marc Dalessio Solo Show” at Grenning Gallery**
