



Watermill Center Fall Artist-in-Residency Program Announced

The Watermill Center announced its artist in residence line up the fall program. Taking place from September 2015 through January 2016, selected artists are Oliver Beer, Amy Khoshbin, Cirkus Cirkör, Manuela Infante with Teatro de Chile, and Carlos Soto. Each artist will spend two to six weeks at Watermill to create collaborative works that critically investigate, challenge, and extend the existing norms of performance practice.

Resident artists are chosen by an international selection committee composed of artist peers, journalists, academics, and other cultural leaders from all disciplines. The current selection committee includes RoseLee Goldberg, John Rockwell, Alanna Heiss, and Jörn Weisbrodt and others. At the end of each artist's residency period, the artist presents an open rehearsal of the work in progress. Admission to the program is free.

Opening the Fall Residency is multi-media artist Oliver Beer from the U.K. who will continue development of his latest work, *The Resonance Project*, during his residency from September 8 to 29, 2015. The Resonance Project is an ongoing body of work consisting of films, sound pieces and performances that use the human voice to stimulate architectural spaces to resound at their resonant frequencies, transforming them into vast architectural instruments.

Jonathan Watkins, Curator and Director of Ikon Gallery, said of the work: "Beer's Resonance Project is wonderfully democratic in its various locations, reminding us that epiphanies can happen anywhere. The human voice, without electronic amplification, with no accompaniment other than its own recycled echoes, occurs to us as a beautiful revelation. The modesty of this work belies its far-reaching implications and the sheer pleasure it gives."
