The popular Birdhouse Auction has morphed into the “Trash to Treasure Auction” featuring creative objects made from recycled, repurposed or redesigned items made by local artisans, craftsmen and builders. The first “Trash to Treasure Auction” will be held Thursday, September 24, 2015 from 6 – 9 p.m. at the Southampton Social Club in Southampton, N.Y.

All items up for auction have been fashioned from found objects, broadening the array of creative objects up for auction. So far, intriguing and attractive objects have been fashioned from diverse materials such as a tree stump, a family heirloom, a wooden chair, yogurt lids and a surfboard.

Proceeds from “Trash to Treasure Auction” help support women in our community with breast and/or gynecological cancers through the non-profit organizations Lucia’s Angels and the Coalition for Women’s Cancers. Both non-profits are based in Southampton.
