No matter what the season, there's always art in the Hamptons and East End of Long Island. We've put together a short list of exhibitions and art events worth noting. Following are our picks of what to do this weekend.

1. ARTIST PROCESS CONVERSATION

"Art/History/Amagansett: Beyond the East End: Artist John Alexander in Conversation with Ruth Appelhof" takes place on Saturday from 6 to 7 p.m. John Alexander will discuss his artistic process with Executive Director of [Guild Hall](#) Ruth Appelhof. 2. GALLERY SHOW

3. MUSEUM EXHIBITION
