## 1. Actors & Projected Film in Noir Premier

"Helen Lawrence" has its U.S. premiere as part of BAM's New Wave October 14 - 17, 2015 at 7:30 p.m. at the Peter Jay Sharp Building. Noir meets avant guard in a collaboration between visual artist Stan Douglas and screenwriter Chris Haddock. Audiences can expect actors performing in projected film on blue screen as 1948 Vancouver comes to life and a killer eludes capture. Tickets are \$30 with discounts available. ## 2. Artist Talk

New York sculptor Arlene Shechet discussed her work on October 15, 2015 at 7 p.m. with Catherine Morris, Sackler Family Curator for the Elizabeth A. Sackler Center for Feminist Art, at the Brooklyn Museum. Working primarily in ceramics, Shechet work fuses contradictions with eccentric and surreal forms that channel abstraction and figuration.

## 3. Sound Sculpture with Animated Film

Visual artist and filmmaker [Brent Green](#) presents his animated films accompanied by a live performance featuring his sound sculptures, live Foley sound effects and a 13-piece band at the Park Avenue Armory on Saturday, October 17 at 8 p.m. Immediately following the performance, Green opens his studio to reveal his creative process.

Green is an artist in residency at the Park Avenue Armory's "Under Construction Series". Green is

currently working on sound sculpture using pipe-organ reeds. His film “EE”, reveals ways people influence others around them.

A self-taught artist, Green’s work has been exhibited or presented MoMA, The J. Paul Getty Museum, The Walker Art Center, The Hammer Museum, The Boston MFA, The Wexner Center for the Arts, The Rotterdam Film Festival, the Sundance Film Festival and more.
