November 3 (Tuesday)

"MAD Ball, Museum of Arts and Design's Annual Gala" takes place on Tuesday, November 3, 2015 at Pier Sixty, Chelsea Piers. The evening, emceed by Simon Doonan, will begin at 6:30 p.m. with cocktails and silent auction, followed by a seated dinner, an awards presentation and live entertainment at 7:30 p.m.

MAD Ball celebrates visionaries in the worlds of business, arts, philanthropy, and creativity.
