# 5 Hamptons Things To Do This Weekend 11.05.15

There are plenty of art and culture events taking place in The Hamptons this weekend. Here's our picks of five cultural events to add to your list. Expect performance, film, talks, live music and more through Saturday, November 7, 2015.

## 1. Wine and Live Jazz Music

Smooth jazz ensemble <u>Certain Moves</u> enliven the main tasting room at Wölffer Estate Vineyard in Sagaponack with music from 5 to 8 p.m. on Friday. The live music is part of Wölffer's "Candlelight Fridays" running through December 18, 2015. Admission is free.

#### 2. Film Screenings, Talk, and Book Signing

Receive an in-depth look at the women painters at the center of The Parrish's exhibition "Jane Freilicher and Jane Wilson: Seen and Unseen". The multimedia program "Circles of Friendship: Freilicher and Wilson" is a combination film screening and talk followed by a book signing. The event takes place on Saturday at 11 a.m.

On tap is the 1952 film *Presenting Jane*, by John Latouche and Harrison Starr, which was conceived by poets John Ashbery, Frank O'Hara and James Schulyer. The film was shot around the East End and hasn't been screened in decades. Thought to be lost after only one showing in 1953, it was rediscovered in 2013 by Ashbery biographer Karin Roffman. The film will be presented alongside a live reading of the script, written by Schuyler.

There will also be a screening of Andy Warhol's 1964 *Screen Test* of Jane Wilson, a black-and-white silent short later incorporated into Warhol's film *The Thirteen Most Beautiful Women.* Following is a talk about Wilson's friendships featuring the Parrish's Lewis B. and Dorothy Cullman Chief Curator Alicia G. Longwell and writer Sam Swasey. Swasey collaborated with John Gruen—photographer and husband to the late Wilson—on his most recent book, *Jane Wilson: Photographs by John Jonas Gruen.* A book signing follows and wraps up the event.

# 3. Rothko Talk & Cirkus Cirkör Open Rehearsal

The Watermill Center presents back to back events on Saturday featuring a lecture on Mark Rothko by biographer <u>Annie Cohen-Solal</u> and an Open Rehearsal with contemporary Swedish circus company <u>Cirkus Cirkor</u>

The day begins with Cohen-Solal, a cultural historian and writer, giving a talk "Mark Rothko: Immigrant, Artist, Pioneer" from 4:30 to 5:30 p.m. The lecture will delve into the "mysterious" artist's life, development, and thinking and connects to Cohen-Solal's recent biography, <u>Mark Rothko: Toward the Light in the Chapel</u> (Yale University Press). A Q & A and book signing immediately follow. <u>Reservations required</u>.

From 6 to 7 p.m., Cirkus Cirkör presents new work developed during their two-week residency at The Watermill Center. Circus members and Founder and Creative Director Tilde Björfors—known for collaborating with artists, illustrators and video-projection mappers— investigated the physical boundaries of circus performance and the theme of borders during the residency.
