



# Museum Look - December 2015 on Long Island

The art museums on Long Island are especially strong in December with plenty of interesting exhibitions presented from East Hampton through Roslyn. New for December is a show of female artists titled "You Go Girl! Celebrating Women Artists" at the Heckscher Museum of Art. Worth noting across Long Island are a new Maxfield Parrish exhibition at the Nassau County Museum of Art and the science-driven exhibition "COMPENDIUM" at the Islip Art Museum.

Continue reading to discover the art possibilities at museums on Long Island from Nassau County to the East End.

## **DAN FLAVIN ART INSTITUTE - BRIDGEHAMPTON, NY**

**"DAN FLAVIN: ICONS"** continues through April 30, 2017. The five wall-mounted "icons" on view bridge the mediums of painting and sculpture. The box-like constructions with painted surfaces and attached light fixtures were created between 1961 and 1964.

**ON PERMANENT VIEW** is an installation by Dan Flavin (1933-1996) of nine works in fluorescent light made between 1963 and 1981. The exhibition follows Flavin's art practice from when he began to work solely with standard fluorescent fixtures and tubes to just before the presentation of his new art form was realized.

## **GUILD HALL MUSEUM - EAST HAMPTON, NY**

**"PORTRAYING ARTISTS: PHOTOGRAPHS BY WALTER WEISSMAN"** continues through January 3, 2016. The exhibition includes 15 intimate black and white portraits of influential performing, literary, fine artists and designers.

**"DANCING WITH TRUFFAUT: STEPHANIE BRODY-LEDERMAN"** continues through January 3, 2016. The exhibition includes eight oil and acrylics on canvas completed during 2014 and 2015 in the artist's New York City and East Hampton studios.

**“CORNELIA FOSS”** continues through January 3, 2016. The exhibition is survey of the artist’s oil on canvas works from the late 1990s through 2014, including seascapes, landscapes, paintings of oases inside New York City’s Central Park and several portraits of family members and friends.

**“SELECTIONS FROM THE PERMANENT COLLECTION”** continues through January 3, 2016. The exhibition presents 62 works that have been inspired by the unique topography of the East End of Long Island.

## **HECKSCHER MUSEUM OF ART - HUNTINGTON, NY**

**“YOU GO GIRL! CELEBRATING WOMEN ARTISTS”** opens on December 5, 2015 and continues through April 3, 2016. This exhibition presents more than 50 artists from the late-19th century through today working in representational and abstract styles. Featured artists include Berenice Abbott, [Elaine de Kooning](#), Dorothy Dehner, Audrey Flack, Jane Hammond, Mary Nimmo Moran, Georgia O’Keeffe, Betty Parsons, [Miriam Schapiro](#), Esphyr Slobodkina, Emma Stebbins and [Jane Wilson](#), among others. The show closes a year of exhibitions drawn exclusively from the Museum’s Permanent Collection, in celebration of their 95th anniversary.

**“MEN AT WORK”** opens on December 5, 2015 and continues through March 27, 2016. The exhibition presents selections from the permanent collection revealing the human experience presented through art featuring tasks undertaken and activities. Includes paintings, sculpture and photographs by artists including William Merritt Chase, Thomas Eakins, George Grosz, John Rogers, Emma Stebbins, John Sloan and others.

**“STREET LIFE: PRIVATE MOMENTS/PUBLIC RECORD”** continues through March 27, 2016. The exhibition serves as a portrait of New York City. Featured artists include Berenice Abbott, N. Jay Jaffee, Martin Lewis, Don Perlis, John Sloan, Garry Winogrand and others.
