AT THE FAIRS

ALICE AYCOCK BREAKFAST TALK

Sculptor Alice Aycock is the featured speaker at this year's 12th annual Breakfast in the Park at the Patricia & Phillip Frost Art Museum FIU. Held on Sunday from 9:30 a.m. to noon, the event is free and features a complimentary outdoor breakfast and guided tour of the sculpture park, in addition to the Talk. Inside the museum are five exhibitions, including "Walls of Color: The Murals of Hans Hofmann".

Alice Aycock is based in The Hamptons and New York City. Most recently, she exhibited a new body of work along the Park Avenue Mall in New York City, following a partial work-in-progress installation at LongHouse Reserve. Her work was also the subject of a solo show at the Parrish Art Museum in Water Mill, NY.

At Art Basel Miami Beach, **Van Doren Waxter** of New York City presents a strong program of artists, with many pulling from Hamptons history. Expect to find works exhibited by Joseph Cornell, Richard Diebenkorn, Sam Francis, Judy Fiskin, Philip Guston, David Hammons, Franz Kline, John McLaughlin, Emil Nolde, Hedda Sterne and Mark Tobey.

Artists with a Hamptons or East End history include Roy Lichtenstein, Conrad Marca-Relli, Alan Shields, Frank Stella and others.

Don't be surprised to also find Frank Stella art presented by [Marianne Boesky Gallery](#) of New York City. Stella's work is the subject of a solo show at the Whitney Museum of American Art in New York City.
