

Museum Look - January 2016 on Long Island

Art in Long Island museums continues to be vibrant in January. New shows include Hofstra University Museum's "Africa: Sub-Saharan Diversity" and a solo show of paintings by Paul Mommer (1899 – 1963) at the Islip Art Museum. Art museum exhibitions worth noting on Long Island this month include "You Go Girl! Celebrating Women Artists" and a companion show, of sorts, "Men at Work" at the Heckscher Art Museum and "Maxfield Parrish: Paintings and Prints" at the Nassau County Museum of Art.

Planning to visit art museums in the Hamptons? Sooner is better than later. Catch the final days for four exhibitions at <u>Guild Hall</u> (through January 2, 2016). At the Parrish, January 18, 2016 signifies the final day for "<u>Jane Freilicher and Jane Wilson: Seen and Unseen</u>" and the installation "<u>Alexis Rockman: East End Field Drawings.</u>" Afterwards, both art museums open student art exhibitions. On long term view are works by <u>Dan Flavin</u> presented museum wide at the <u>Dan Flavin Art Institute</u> in Bridgehampton. Open weekends only.

DAN FLAVIN ART INSTITUTE - BRIDGEHAMPTON, NY

"DAN FLAVIN: ICONS" continues through April 30, 2017. The five wall-mounted "icons" on view in the exhibition bridge the mediums of painting and sculpture. The box-like constructions with painted surfaces and attached light fixtures were created between 1961 and 1964.

ON PERMANENT VIEW is an installation by Dan Flavin (1933-1996) of nine works in fluorescent light made between 1963 and 1981. The exhibition follows Flavin's art practice from when he began to work solely with standard fluorescent fixtures and tubes to just before the presentation of his new art form was realized.

<u>Dan Flavin Art Institute</u> is located on Corwith Avenue, about 1/2 block from Main Street, Bridgehampton, NY 11932. The museum is open weekends from noon to 6 p.m. For details and programming, visit <u>www.diaart.org</u>.

GUILD HALL MUSEUM - EAST HAMPTON, NY

"DANCING WITH TRUFFAUT: STEPHANIE BRODY-LEDERMAN" continues through January 3, 2016. The exhibition includes eight oil and acrylics on canvas completed during 2014 and 2015 in

the artist's New York City and East Hampton studios.

"CORNELIA FOSS" continues through January 3, 2016. <u>The exhibition</u> is survey of the artist's oil on canvas works from the late 1990s through 2014, including seascapes, landscapes, paintings of oases inside New York City's Central Park and several portraits of family members and friends.

"SELECTIONS FROM THE PERMANENT COLLECTION" continues through January 3, 2016. The exhibition presents 62 works that have been inspired by the unique topography of the East End of Long Island.

"STUDENT ARTS FESTIVAL: PART I, GRADES K-8" opens on January 16 and continues through February 21, 2016. An Opening Reception will be held on January 23 from 2 to 4 p.m. Now in its 24th year, the Student Arts Festival celebrates young artists enrolled in schools from Bridgehampton to Montauk. "Student Arts Festival Part II, Grades 9-12" opens on March 5.

"PORTRAYING ARTISTS: PHOTOGRAPHS BY WALTER WEISSMAN" continues through February 21, 2016. <u>The exhibition</u> includes 15 intimate black and white portraits of influential performing, literary, fine artists and designers.

HECKSCHER MUSEUM OF ART - HUNTINGTON, NY

"YOU GO GIRL! CELEBRATING WOMEN ARTISTS" continues through April 3, 2016. This exhibition presents more than 50 artists from the late-19th century through today working in representational and abstract styles. Featured artists include Berenice Abbott, Elaine de Kooning, Dorothy Dehner, Audrey Flack, Jane Hammond, Mary Nimmo Moran, Georgia O'Keeffe, Betty Parsons, Miriam Schapiro, Esphyr Slobodkina, Emma Stebbins and Jane Wilson, among others. The show closes a year of exhibitions drawn exclusively from the Museum's Permanent Collection, in celebration of their 95th anniversary.

"MEN AT WORK" continues through March 27, 2016. The exhibition presents selections from the permanent collection revealing the human experience presented through art featuring tasks undertaken and activities. Includes paintings, sculpture and photographs by artists including William Merritt Chase, Thomas Eakins, George Grosz, John Rogers, Emma Stebbins, John Sloan and others.

"STREET LIFE: PRIVATE MOMENTS/PUBLIC RECORD" continues through March 27, 2016. The exhibition serves as a portrait of New York City. Featured artists include Berenice Abbott, N. Jay Jaffee, Martin Lewis, Don Perlis, John Sloan, Garry Winogrand and others.

HOFSTRA UNIVERSITY MUSEUM - HEMPSTEAD, NY

"AFRICA: SUB-SAHARAN DIVERSITY" opens on January 26, 2016 and continues through August 12, 2016 in the Emily Lowe Gallery. Drawn exclusively from the Museum's Collections, the exhibition presents art and artifacts from cultures across West and Central Africa. Masks, weapons, sculptures, and jewelry will be on view.

"ENDURING IMAGES" continues through January 31, 2016 in the Filderman Gallery. The exhibition focuses on the lasting record created by an artist's visual responses to critical moments in history. Examples include imagery reflecting the impact of World War I and II, civil rights, the African-American diaspora, and other international conflicts. Works in a variety of media will be on view, including photography, sculpture, painting, and works on paper.
