1. “Dead Accounts” Presented by the Hampton Theatre Company

The second play of the Hampton Theatre Company’s 2015-2016 season opens on January 14 at 7 p.m. at the Quogue Community Hall. “Dead Accounts” is Theresa Rebeck’s darkly comic take on the chasm that divides Americans in the midwest from their countrymen living in New York. The play is directed by Andrew Botsford. Performances run through January 31, 2016 with shows on Thursdays and Fridays at 7, Saturdays at 8 and Sundays at 2:30. The performance on Thursday, January 21, will be followed by a talkback with members of the cast and the director.
