1. Alvin Ailey II 2016 NYC Season

The <u>Alvin Ailey Dance Foundation</u> presents Alvin Ailey II 2016 NYC Season at the Alvin Citigroup Theater. Performances will take place from March 30 through April 10, 2016. For a full schedule of the dance programs, click <u>here</u>.

This season features a company of 12 on-their-way-to-the-top dancers as well as a selection of emerging talents. Performances rotate between the "All New Program" with choreography by Kyle "JustSole" Clark, Jean Emile, Ray Mercer, and Ailey dancer Jamar Roberts, and the "Returning Favorites Program" with crowd-pleasers from recent seasons by choreographers Jennifer Archibald, Dwight Rhoden, and Manuel Vignoulle.

3. Closing Reception and Artist Panel at the Queens Museum

A Closing Reception and Artist Panel for "welcome to what we took from is the state" takes place on Saturday, April 2, 2016 from 2 to 4 p.m. at the Queens Museum. The Closing Reception features a panel with participating artists, including Sue Jeong Ka, Anushya Badrinath, Umber Majeed, and Ayesha Kamal Khan. The show is the South Asian Women's Creative Collective's annual visual arts exhibition. The exhibition features works by South Asian Women Artists created in reaction to warhungry politics of the state that promote conflict and break the social bonds between people of different cultures and geographical origins.

4. Guggenheim's Sixth Annual Robert Rosenblum Lecture: Huey Copeland

The Guggenheim will present the Sixth Annual Robert Rosenblum Lecture on April 4, 2016 at 6:30 p.m.

This year's lecture features Art Historian <u>Huey Copeland</u> discussing "Solar Ethics." While commentators have made much of musician, writer, and composer <u>Sun Ra</u>'s troping on black alienation, particularly his embrace of outer space, equally important to his intellectual project was a radical rethinking of the logics of Western temporality. Copeland argues that Ra's thinking points toward new criteria for the evaluation of recent art that considers both the recursiveness and simultaneity of time as it unfolds within, beyond, and across the black world. The implications for contemporary artists is discussed in Copeland's lecture.

The Lecture is currently at capacity. Stand-by tickets will be distributed, as available, on a first come, first served basis beginning at 6:15 p.m. on the day of the lecture. A reception immediately

follows.

7. Charles Gaines: Sound Text and Manifestos at The Brooklyn Museum

The performance "<u>Charles Gaines</u>: Sound Text and Manifestos" will take place on April 7, 2016 at 7 p.m. at the Brooklyn Museum. The event will take place in the Iris and B. Gerald Cantor Auditorium on the third floor.

Gaines will present two of his major works, *Sound Text* (2015) and excerpts from *Manifestos* (2008) with musical arrangement by composer Sean Griffin. Gaines transcribes revolutionary declarations and political documents into musical notations. Both pieces will be performed by an eight-piece ensemble backed by a large-scale video projection.

9. Live Performance by Rosa Barba at MoMA PS1

The artist <u>Rosa Barba</u> presents *White Museum – Live* on April 10, 2016 from Noon to 6 p.m. at MoMA PS1. Live performances by the artists will take place within the installation at 4 and 5 p.m.

During White Museum – Live, Barba plays with the light emitted from a 70mm projector as though it was an instrument. The work is a continuation of Barba's series "White Museum" began in 2010 with long-term projections of empty white film onto surrounding landscapes at international museums. For the installation and performance at MoMA PS1, Rosa Barba will illuminate the inside of the VW Dome and focus on interior space rather than exterior to create a performative installation that is both visual concert and sculpture of light.
