The winners of Hamptons Art Hub's "Art Inspired by Water" open call have been announced. Winners for Fine Art are Livia Mosanu and Steve Miller. The open call competition was judged by Museum Director and Chief Curator Christina Mossaides Strassfield of Guild Hall Museum in East Hampton, NY; Gallerist Kathryn Markel of Kathryn Markel Fine Arts in New York City and Bridgehampton, NY; and Gallerist and fine art photographer Robin Rice of Robin Rice Gallery in New York City.

A Steve Zaluski sculpture recently installed outside a new East Hampton art school must be removed as prior approval wasn't secured in accordance with East Hampton Village Code, reported <u>The East Hampton Star</u>. The artwork was installed by art dealer Karyn Mannix outside of her new art school, <u>The Mannix Studio of Art</u>, which opened last month and offers art classes to children and adults. Mannix has 30 days to remove the artwork before fines will be levied.

Almond's restaurant is celebrating its 15th Anniversary in Bridgehampton by assisting a photographer in need. Instead of hosting its popular Artists & Writers Night, the restaurant is hosting an anniversary celebration and fundraiser for Hamptons photographer Eric Striffler who lost his worldly possessions (including all his camera equipment) in a house fire in March.
