New York City is buzzing with art and culture events over the next two weeks. In this installment of our *Things To Do in NYC* column, expect performance art, discussions led by artists and designers, a garden party, an awards ceremony and live music. 1. Beth Gill - Catacomb Performances

The Chocolate Factory Theater presents "Beth Gill – Catacomb" from May 18 to 28, 2016. Performances will take place Wednesdays through Saturdays at 8 p.m., with and additional performance on Tuesday May 24, 2016 at 8 p.m.

Choreographer <u>Beth Gill</u>, with long-time design collaborators <u>Thomas Dunn</u> (lighting) and <u>Jon Moniaci</u> (sound), returns to the Chocolate Factory for a new site-specific performance. Inspired by the imagination and the subconscious, the piece creates a dreamlike, sensory-rich world, which fully immerses the audience. Gill creates an intimate, surrealist space that builds on the formalism of her past several works, while forging new psychologically driven terrain through her recent explorations.

9. 2016 Sackler Center First Awards

<u>The Brooklyn Museum</u> presents the 2016 Sackler Center First Awards on Thursday, June 2, 2016 from 6 to 9 p.m. The Reception will be from 6 to 7 p.m., the program from 7 to 8:30 p.m., and dinner will be at 8:30 p.m.

The <u>Elizabeth A. Sackler Center for Feminist Art</u> at the Brooklyn Museum will present the Sackler Center First Awards, honoring women who are first in their fields. This year, Angela Y. Davis, a Feminist Scholar Activist for Social Justice will be honored. The awards ceremony includes a welcome by New York City First Lady Chirlane McCray, highlights from *Free Angela* by Shola Lynch, a conversation with Gloria Steinem and an award presentation with Elizabeth A. Sackler.

10. Ligeti Forward Performance at the Met

The <u>Metropolitan Museum of Art</u> presents *Ligeti Forward* on Friday, June 3 at 7 p.m., on Saturday, June 4 at 7 p.m. and on Sunday June 5 at 2 p.m.

Hungarian György Ligeti said he saw colors when he heard sounds. On the tenth anniversary of the composer's death, MetLiveArts will team up with the <u>New York Philharmonic</u> and the Ensemble of the <u>LUCERNE FESTIVAL ALUMNI</u> for a three-concert mini-marathon focusing on the music of Ligeti as well as the successors he influenced.

Each concert in *Ligeti Forward* pairs one of Ligeti's concertos with new works that it inspired. Alan Gilbert and David Fulmer will conduct the performances and the ensemble will be made up of the LUCERNE FESTIVAL ALUMNI. On Friday Conor Hanick will perform on the piano, on Saturday Jay Campbell will play the cello and on Sunday Pekka Kuusisto will perform on the violin. These events will also be <u>live-streamed</u>.
