To celebrate the release of <u>Clara Bingham</u>'s book *Witness to the Revolution*, the Brooklyn Museum presents a reading, Q&A with the author and a book signing. The book documents the tumultuous period in American society as the 1960s drew to a close. Woven together from 100 original interviews with activists, organizers and radicals, the book provides a narrative of the counterculture that challenged the norms of work and family life, economic and political systems, gender roles and more.
