7. La Dolce Vita Film Screening

The Morgan Library and Museum presents *La Dolce Vita* on Friday, July 15, 2016 at 7 p.m. The exhibition "<u>City of the Soul: Rome and the Romantics</u>" will be open for program attendees before the screening.
