Parrish Road Show Part II - Toni Ross

This weekend, Toni Ross unveils her Parrish Road Show installation at Marder's in Bridgehampton with an Opening Reception on Saturday from 5 to 7 p.m. and an Artists Talk on Sunday at 11 a.m. Toni Ross is intrigued by the intersection of diverse objects and materials, especially those that defy logic. These concepts are often represented by fine threads that bind powerful, weighty forms. For her Parrish Road Show, *Permanent Transience*, the artist creates a juxtaposition of materials through an installation of sculpted straw bales that intersect and envelop three massive on-site boulders.
