"Art/History/Amagansett" Conversation series

Kicking off this weekend is the annual series on art and history presented by the Amagansett Free Library. Their series hosts two distinct conversation programs with one exploring the art, artists, and cultural institutions important to the East End with the other exploring the practical side of art. On Saturday, September 10, 2016 at 6 p.m., "The House That Jack Built," presents the art, environment, and history of LongHouse Reserve in East Hampton featuring LongHouse Reserve Executive Director Matko Tomicic and Board President Dianne Benson (a.k.a. Dianne B.) in a discussion moderated by Joan Baum, NPR commentator. On Sunday, September 11, at 6 p.m., Springs attorney Carol Steinberg presents "Copyright and Collaboration 101.5," exploring legal issues for artists. Artist Bastienne Schmidt discusses her latest book, *Typology of Women*, at an Artist Talk and Book Signing at Bookhampton in East Hampton on Saturday at 5 p.m. *Typology of Women*, published by Jovis, features a series of hand-painted orange cutouts representing different types of women as they have been historically represented in pop culture and literature in a range of global cultures. Referencing ancient Greek pottery, Japanese woodcuts, fairy tales and American pop culture, the

figures are vaguely familiar and distinctively female yet remain mysterious and difficult to quickly place. Chamber Music Concert

Quogue Chamber Music concludes its 2016 season with a chamber music concert featuring the Attacca Quartet performing works by Haydn, Janáček and Beethoven. The concert will take place on Saturday, September 10, 2016, at 7:30 p.m. at the Quogue Community Hall. A celebration at a private home immediately follows. The award-winning Attacca Quartet First Prize was formed 13 years ago at Julliard. Since then, the quartet has received awards at the Osaka International Chamber Music Competition, the Melbourne International Chamber Music Competition, the Coleman Chamber Ensemble Competition. They were recently named Quartet in Residence for the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City. Saturday's concert in Quogue will include Haydn String Quartet, Op. 76, #5, Janáček String Quartet #1, and Beethoven String Quartet Op. 59, #3.

Tickets for the concert are \$40 for adults and \$5 for children, and \$100 for the concert and celebration.
