Expect to find lectures, conversations, a new interpretation of music by John Cage, dance and more. All events are happening in New York City through October 9, 2016.

1. Visionaries Series: Fran Lebowitz at New Museum

The New Museum presents the "Visionaries Series: Fran Lebowitz In Conversation with Martin Scorsese," on **Tuesday, September 27, 2016 at 7 p.m.** The conversation will be held in the New Museum Theater.

Raconteur, essayist, and critic <u>Fran Lebowitz</u> will be featured as this year's Visionary speaker at the New Museum. The Stuart Regen Visionaries Series honors forward-thinking front-runners in the fields of art, architecture, design, film, and related disciplines of contemporary culture. Now in its eighth season, the annual series spotlights innovators who shape intellectual life and the future of culture. Lebowitz will appear in conversation with legendary filmmaker <u>Martin Scorsese</u>.

4. After 9 Evenings: John Cage's "Variations VII" Realized by Ed Bear

ISSUE Project Room presents "After 9 Evenings: A 50th Anniversary Celebration: John Cage's "Variations VII" Realized by Ed Bear," on **Saturday, October 1, 2016 at 8 p.m.** "After 9 Evenings: A 50th Anniversary Celebration" presents a series of performances, talks, screenings, and workshops to mark the 50th anniversary of 9 Evenings: Theatre & Engineering (1966).

Performing artist and electrical engineer <u>Ed Bear</u> presents a newly commissioned interpretation of <u>John Cage</u>'s infamous "<u>Variations VII</u>." The piece consists of readily available "sounds from the ether," or technologically produced sound extracted from a variety of sources, either transmitted or picked up live in the performance space. Bear and his team will create an interwoven tapestry of live sound sources that include photocells, radios, brainwaves, heartbeats, cell phones, handmade synthesizers and more.

Choreographer and painter <u>Shen Wei</u> (Park Avenue Armory, 2011; 2008 Beijing Olympics Opening Ceremony) makes his BAM debut with a dance-based interpretation of Morton Feldman's 1977 anti-opera for orchestra and soprano. With a 16-line libretto by Samuel Beckett, "Neither" weaves 12 dancers into Feldman's score, setting Shen Wei's painterly choreography amid large moving set pieces and visuals of his own design.

9. Lecture at Whitney

The Whitney Museum of American Art presents "The Falsification of Time: Carol Mancusi-Ungaro and Yve-Alain Bois on Art Conversation," on **Thursday, October 6, 2016 from 6:30 to 8 p.m.** The event will be held on floor three, in the Susan and John Hess Family Theater.

Carol Mancusi-Ungaro, Melva Bucksbaum Associate Director for Conservation and Research, will present a lecture titled "The Falsification of Time," a term used by artist <u>Sol LeWitt</u>. The lecture will address issues associated with the art of our time, including replication and 3D printing, in the historical context of art conservation. Yve-Alain Bois, Professor of Art History at the Institute for Advanced Study, will join Mancusi-Ungaro in conversation after the lecture.

11. Liberate Tate: Insides/Outsides Talk at Queens Museum

The Queens Museum presents "Liberate Tate: Insides/Outsides: An Open A.I.R. Artists Services Talk," on Sunday, October 9, 2016 from 3 to 5 p.m.

<u>Liberate Tate</u> is an art collective that has been exploring the role of creative intervention in social change by making unsanctioned Live Art in <u>Tate</u> gallery spaces since 2010. Their aim, to free art from the oil industry, initially prompted the art museum Tate to end its corporate sponsorship with BP. The collective succeeded by March 2016 when Tate announced that from 2017 it would no longer receive funding from oil giant BP. In this two-hour talk and discussion Liberate Tate will show films, share strategies and processes and talk about how they operated both inside and outside the gallery to shift power and transform perceptions.
