Five Things to Do in NYC Through October 18, 2016

Looking for things to do in New York City with an art and culture twist? We've got you covered. In this edition, we've selected noteworthy events through October 18, 2016 to put on your calendar. Expect to find live music, dance performances, film, Carmen Herrera explored, the chance to get up close and personal with architectural marvels and more. Read on to discover our picks for events to enjoy in NYC in October.

1. Circle Map Performances and Artist Talk

The Park Avenue Armory presents "Circle Map: Kaija Saariaho, New York Philharmonic, Esa-Pekka Salonen" on **Thursday, October 13 and Friday, October 14, 2016 at 7 p.m.** Performances will be held at the Park Avenue Armory Wade Thompson Drill Hall and are approximately 90 minutes without intermission.

Finnish composer <u>Kaija Saariaho</u> is making a mark on the contemporary musical landscape through her expansive, deeply emotional soundscapes. The New York Philharmonic will perform some of her seminal works under the baton of the Philharmonic's Marie-Josée Kravis Composer-in-Residence and Saariaho's fellow countryman <u>Esa-Pekka Salonen</u>.

The program features the New York premieres of "Circle Map," a new work for orchestra and electronics that builds out from six stanzas by the 13th-century Persian poet Rumi, and D'om le Vrai Sens, written for and performed at the Park Avenue Armory while moving through the audience and orchestra by clarinetist Kari Krikku. The evening also includes the U.S. premiere of "Lumière et Pesanteur" as well as "Lonh," a work sung by rising soprano Jennifer Zetlan, with an electronic score that manipulates sounds from nature to evoke a distant landscape.

On Friday, October 14, 2016 at 6 p.m. and immediately before the performance, "Artist Talk: Circle Map" features composer Kaija Saariaho, video projection designer Jean-Baptiste Barrière, lighting designer Jennifer Tipton, and Park Avenue Armory Artistic Director Pierre Audi in conversation on Circle Map." The panel will be moderated by violist Nadia Sirota.

2. "Vortex Temporum" Performance at BAM

The Brooklyn Academy of Music presents the US premiere of "Vortex Temporum" on Friday, October 14 and on Saturday, October 15, 2016 at 7:30 p.m. Performances will be held in the BAM Howard Gilman Opera House.

This performance is part of <u>2016 Next Wave Festival</u>. In this work by the Belgian choreographer <u>Anne Teresa De Keersmaeker</u>, seven dancers inhabit late French composer <u>Gérard Grisey</u>'s three distinct ways of perceiving the passing seconds of time, using his 1996 work "Vortex Temporum" as guide. Pairing off with seven roving musicians from Ictus Ensemble, they perform a measure-by-measure translation of Grisey's score. The meditative work creates the impression of circles forming within circles, mirroring the idea of time spiraling on.

4. Carmen Herrera Program at The Whitney

The Whitney Museum of American Art presents the special program "Carmen Herrera and the 100 Years Show" on **Sunday, October 16, 2016 from 4 to 5:30 p.m.** The program will be held on floor three, in the Susan and John Hess Family Theater and is in support of the current exhibition "Carmen Herrera: Lines of Sight."

Carmen Herrera and the 100 Years Show" begins with a screening of "<u>The 100 Years Show</u>" (30 minutes, 2015), a documentary directed by Alison Klayman that combines verité footage from the years leading up to Carmen Herrera's 100th birthday with interviews and archival images of Herrera's life and work. The screening is followed by a panel conversation about Herrera's practice and reception, and abstraction in contemporary art practice. The panel is moderated by scholar Edward J. Sullivan, who contributed to the catalogue for "Carmen Herrera: Lines of Sight" with filmmaker Alison Klayman, artist Sarah Crowner, and scholar Abigail McEwen.
