1. The Garment District Arts Festival

The 2016 Garment District Arts Festival takes place on October 20, 21 and 22, 2016.

For the 13th Annual Garment District Arts Festival, artists, galleries, performance spaces and theaters will open their doors and in some cases, head down to the street, allowing visitors to experience their art. 2. Yasmeen Godder Performance

Gibeny Dance presents "Yasmeen Godder: CLIMAX" from Thursday, October 20 to Saturday, October 22, 2016 at 8 p.m.

Tel Aviv-based artist <u>Yasmeen Godder</u> presents *CLIMAX*, an active invitation for the audience to move as they engage in an emotionally intimate, yet provocative performance. Deconstructing and integrating older works and movement phrases from Godder's 15-year career, *CLIMAX* speaks

about togetherness and insecurity, about connectivity and infectiousness while rethinking the relationship between audiences and performers. *CLIMAX* invites the audience to make choices about their own spectatorship throughout the performance's three-hour duration.

3. Maryanne Amacher Archive Seminar and Listening Session

The Kitchen presents "Maryanne Amacher: Labyrinth Gives Way to Skin – Stolen Souls" presented in two linked programs. "The Seminar: The Mini Sound Series" will be held on Friday, October 21, 2016 from 6:30 to 9:30 p.m. "The Listening Session" will be held on Saturday, October 22, 2016 from 8 to 9:30 p.m.

"Stolen Souls" is the third installment of "Labyrinth Gives Way To Skin," <u>Blank Forms</u>' ongoing collaboration with the <u>Maryanne Amacher</u> Archive which explores the work of the pioneering composer through a series of seminars and listening sessions. Due to the avant-garde nature of Amacher's project, Blank Forms offers a hybrid presentation format—a seminar followed by a listening session—to offer visitors different degrees of engagement with the material.

Seminars encourage in-depth examinations of particular clusters of digitized Amacher documents. Led by an expert (Amacher collaborators, academics, and members of the Amacher Archive team), visitor-participants are guided through the conceptual, formal, and biographical details of particular Amacher works. Following the seminar, the listening sessions present newly digitized audio documents related to or adjacent to the works and concepts discussed in the seminar.

Agha will discuss her monumental hanging sculpture *All the Flowers are for Me*, on view in the BAM Fisher lobby.

5. Concert at The Guggenheim

The Guggenheim Museum presents "Commedia dell'arte by John Zorn" on **Sunday, October 23, 2016 at 9 p.m.** The performance will be held in the Peter B. Lewis Theater.

American composer and new music pioneer <u>John Zorn</u> will present *Commedia dell'arte*, a suite of five miniatures inspired by the dell'arte characters Harlequin, Colombina, Scaramouche, Pulcinella, and Pierrot. After the performance Zorn will participate in a moderated discussion. This performance is part of the <u>Works & Process</u> series.
