## 1. Jérôme Bel Performances at MoMA

The Museum of Modern Art presents "Jérôme Bel: Artist's Choice: MoMA Dance Company from **Thursday, October 27 to Monday, October 31, 2016 at 12:30 and 3 p.m. daily.** Performances will be held in the Marron Atrium.

MoMA will premiere a new work by Bel as part of MoMA's longstanding Artist's Choice series, with *Artist's Choice: Jérôme Bel / MoMA Dance Company (2016)*. Created specifically for the Museum's Marron Atrium, through an open call, MoMA Dance Company brings together MoMA staff members from different departments, subverting the category of a dance company as well as the exhibition series' habitual focus on objects.

Presented on the occasion of [Crossing the Line Festival 2016](#) by the French Institute Alliance Française (FIAF), The Joyce Theater, The Kitchen, and The Museum of Modern Art.

### **3. Conversation with Ai Weiwei and Tania Bruguera at Brooklyn Museum**

The Brooklyn Museum presents “In Conversation: Ai Weiwei and Tania Bruguera” on **Saturday, October 29, 2016 from 2 to 3:30 p.m.** The conversation will be held in the Iris and B. Gerald Cantor Auditorium.

[Ai Weiwei](#), one of China’s most prolific and provocative contemporary artists, will join the Cuban-born artist [Tania Bruguera](#) for a conversation. The event is timed to coincide with Ai’s first visit to Brooklyn since the return of his passport last year, and after a four-year ban on international travel. Ai will discuss his current projects and his ongoing quest for greater worldwide social and civic justice. Together, Ai and Bruguera also will explore their mutual interests in positioning their work as a catalyst for change.

## 4. Rules Of The Game by Jonah Bokaer and Daniel Arsham

The Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum presents “Rules Of The Game by Jonah Bokaer and Daniel Arsham” on **Monday, October 31, 2016 at 7:30 p.m.** The event will be held in the Peter B. Lewis Theater. Enter via the ramp at 88th Street and 5th Avenue.

Choreographer [Jonah Bokaer](#) and scenographer [Daniel Arsham](#)’s largest collaboration yet, “[Rules Of The Game](#)” is a new multidisciplinary work for eight dancers. It features an original score by Pharrell Williams, arranged, conducted, and co-composed by David Campbell and recorded by the Dallas Symphony Orchestra. Bokaer will discuss the collaboration, and excerpts will be performed before the New York premiere at [BAM’s](#) Next Wave Festival. This even is part of the [Works & Process](#) series.

## 5. Literary Talk: David Salle at BAM

BAM presents “Unbound: David Salle” on **Tuesday, November 1, 2016 at 7 p.m.** The talk will be held at the BAMcafe in the Peter Jay Sharp Building.

Artist David Salle comes to BAM to discuss his work—and the theory behind it—in conversation with Lorin Stein, Editor of the Paris Review. Painter [David Salle](#) distills contemporary art to its essentials in his new series of essays, “How to See: Looking, Talking, and Thinking about Art.” Salle shows readers how to see like artists, and paints intimate portraits of his friends and contemporaries, from [Roy Lichtenstein](#) to [Jeff Koons](#).
