"Artists Choose Artists" at the Parrish

The Parrish Art Museum's third iteration of the "<u>Artists Choose Artists</u>" exhibition will open on Sunday, October 30, 2016, at 1 p.m. following a talk and <u>members' reception</u> starting at 11 a.m., and will run through January 16, 2017.

The exhibition offers a chance to see art of the East End chosen by a jury of seven artists, including <u>Cindy Sherman</u> and <u>Lynda Benglis</u>. Each member of the jury chose two selections after viewing nearly 200 online submissions and conducting studio visits. The exhibition will feature painting, sculpture, photography and mixed media by both the jurors and the 14 artists they selected.

"Artists Choose Artists" jurors and the artists they selected are: <u>Tina Barney</u> with <u>Dinah Maxwell</u> <u>Smith</u> and <u>RJT Haynes</u>; Lynda Benglis with <u>Garrett Chingery</u> and <u>Saskia Friedrich</u>; <u>Tony Oursler</u> with <u>Jackie Black</u> and <u>Marianne Weil</u>; <u>Donald Lipski</u> with <u>Suzanne Anker</u> and <u>Ben Butler</u>; <u>Jorge Pardo</u> with Anne Bae and <u>Monica Banks</u>; Cindy Sherman with <u>Bill Komoski</u> and <u>Toni Ross</u>; and <u>Leo Villareal</u> with <u>Karin Waisman</u> and <u>Almond Zigmund</u>.

Five of the artists participating in the exhibition—Suzanne Anker, Monica Banks, Ben Butler, Saskia Friedrich and Karin Waisman—will also be leading workshops as part of the annual Artist-in-Residence program at the Parrish.

Jack Ferver's "Chambre" at Watermill Center

"Chambre," a hybrid interdisciplinary performance and art installation, will be presented at the Watermill Center on Saturday, October 29, 2016 only as part of the Center's new reACT program. The planned Sunday performance has been cancelled, according to Watermill Center.

Jack Ferver, a past artist-in-residence at the Watermill Center in 2014, created the choreography and text for the piece. The installation is by <u>Marc Swanson</u>; costumes by <u>Reid Bartelme</u>; and sound score by <u>Roarke Menzies</u>. "Chambre" was inspired by Jean Genet's play "Les Bonnes" ("The Maids") and the real-life murder the play was based on. In it, Ferver examines notions of otherness, gender politics, celebrity culture, class division and the violence that often ensues.

Jack Ferver is a New York based writer, choreographer, director and actor. His work has been presented at the New Museum in New York City, the Institute of Contemporary Art in Boston and the Théâtre de Vanves in France. The reACT program will feature past artists-in-residence, providing them with a space to present original works that are intimately linked to the Watermill Center.

Doors will open at 5 p.m. for complimentary cocktails and the hour-long show will begin at 6 p.m. Tickets are \$30.

Guild Hall Gallery Talk

Guild Hall in East Hampton will host a gallery talk between exhibiting artist William S. Heppenheimer and Stephanie deTroy Miller, a curatorial assistant, at 2 p.m. on Saturday, October 29, 2016.

William S. Heppenheimer is currently enjoying his first solo museum exhibition at Guild Hall after winning best in show honors at the museum's Artists Members Exhibition in 2014. Heppenheimer creates abstracted, kaleidoscopic works of art by pouring acrylic paint into ice trays that he swirls to create marbleized effects. The swirled paints are later cut into small cross sections and arranged into geometric forms and totems that play with notions of abstraction and representation, according to the museum's website.

Heppenheimer's work will be on display at the museum until Saturday, December 31, 2016. Admission is free. Guild Hall is located at 158 Main Street, East Hampton, NY 11937.
