1. New York Print Week 2016

2. Gina Gibney: *Folding In* Performance

[Gibney Dance](#) Company presents the premiere of "[Folding In](#)" by Gina Gibney, performances will be held **November 2 through 12, 2016** at Gibney Dance. An Opening Night Celebration will be held on Wednesday, November 2 at 7 p.m. Performances will be held Thursday, November 3 to Saturday, November 5, Thursday, November 10 to Friday, November 11 at 8 p.m., and on Saturday, November 12 at 5 p.m. A Closing Night Celebration will be held on Saturday, November 12 at 7 p.m.

"Folding In" is a meditation on the cycle of extension, resolution, and return. The work exposes the natural state of the body and how it seeks inevitable but unknowable endings. Gina Gibney and her company of collaborators seek to learn about and find one another through the process of developing the work. The performances features a score by Icelandic cellist and composer Hildur Guðnadóttir, lighting by Asami Morita, costumes by Felicity Sargent, and is performed by Gibney Dance Company: Nigel Campbell, Kassandra Cruz, Amy Miller, Devin Oshiro, and Brandon Welch.

Artist, writer and activist Sabra Moore reads from and discusses her new book "[Openings: A Memoir from the Women's Art Movement](#)." The book is a memoir that chronicles twenty-two years of her life and interactions with other women artists, finding ways to create politically and personally meaningful artworks, exhibitions, protests, and institutions in response to war, government corruption, struggles for reproductive freedom, and racial tension - all while fighting for greater representation and opportunities for women in the art world.

4. The New York Times Feminist Reading Group

Whitney Museum of American Art presents "The New York Times Feminist Reading Group" on **Saturday, November 5, 2016 from 1 to 2:30 p.m.** The event will take place on floor three, Laurie M. Tisch Education Center, Hearst Artspace.

On the occasion of the historic 2016 U.S. presidential election, artists [Jen Kennedy](#) and [Liz Linden](#) perform their ongoing project "The New York Times Feminist Reading Group," which is dedicated to reading the day's issue of The New York Times from a feminist perspective. This project combines different models of feminist gatherings, including consciousness-raising groups of the 1960s and 70s activism, academic seminar formats, and socially oriented book-clubs most often convened in the hosts' domestic spaces. Because current events are a fluid and changing subject matter, each performance differs dramatically, shaped as well by the political positions of the participants in the room.

5. Bread and Roses: A Dinner-Symposium on Women and the Arts at MoMA PS1

MoMA PS1 presents "Bread and Roses: A Dinner-Symposium on Women and the Arts" on **Sunday, November 6, 2016 at 6:30 p.m.**

"Bread and Roses" brings together a multigenerational mix of female-identifying artists, writers, and others to exchange ideas about women in the arts over food and drink. Hosted by MoMA PS1 with Negar Azimi, Pati Hertling, Mina Stone and Anicka Yi, the event features a dinner provided

by Lil' Deb's Oasis, and toasts from Hannah Black, Justin Vivian Bond, Kimberly Drew, Eileen Myles, Alice Waters and others. Drawing upon the Hellenic custom of the symposium (from the Greek *sympinein* "to drink together") in which the ancients gathered amid feast, song, and dance to discourse on philosophical questions, this program combines serious discussion with celebration—out of the belief that debate, collectivity, and activism are produced by mind and body alike.
