Check out our best bets for things to do this weekend: open rehearsals at the Watermill Center; a book signing at the Parrish Art Museum; a concert at the Southampton Arts Center; an autumn walk at LongHouse in East Hampton; and the start of a collaborative dance, music and art series organized by East End Arts and Peconic Ballet Theatre in Riverhead.

Open Rehearsals at Watermill Art Center

The Watermill Center will host open rehearsals of pieces by artists Andrew Ondrejcak and Ebe Oke on Saturday, November 5, 2016 starting at 2 p.m..

<u>Andrew Ondrejcak</u>, an artist-in-residence at the Center who is known for large-scale environmental installations, will be rehearsing his new opera, inspired by Virginia Woolf's "Orlando." <u>Shara Nova</u>, the musician behind the indie/pop act My Brightest Diamond, composed the music and will perform the title role in the opera, which explores themes of gender and identity.

<u>Ebe Oke</u> will follow Ondrejcak with new electronic works at 3 p.m. Oke—an experimental artist, electroacoustic composer and performance poet—will perform pop music that explores the idea of "otherness." As a multi-disciplinary artist, Oke has worked in various media including photography, design, performance and video. His work at the Watermill Center will incorporate language experiments, structural maps and rhythmic guides.

The open rehearsals will be followed by an artists' reception at 4 p.m.

Illustrated Art Talk on Trisha Brown at the Parrish

The Parrish Art Museum will be hosting "Susan Rosenberg on Trisha Brown: Choreography as Visual Art"—an illustrated talk, Q&A and book signing—on Friday, November 4, 2016 at 6 p.m.

Susan Rosenberg, an art historian, will talk about her recently published book, "Trisha Brown: Choreography as Visual Art," in which Rosenberg followed the trajectory of Brown's decades-long career. The book is the first in-depth study on the work of <u>Trisha Brown</u>, the groundbreaking postmodern artist and choreographer who helped re-shape modern dance, according to the museum.

Trisha Brown, who created more than 100 dances, six operas, one ballet and a body of graphic works, was the first female choreographer to receive the MacArthur "Genius Award." She was a member of the influential Judson Dance Theater in the 1960s and established the Trisha Brown Dance Company in 1970.

The talk will be followed by a Q&A facilitated by Corinne Erni, the curator of special projects at the Parrish, and a book signing. Copies of the book will be available for purchase at the museum store.

Tickets are \$10, or free for Parrish members, children and students.

Art Barre Begins in Riverhead

East End Arts and Peconic Ballet Theatre will present "Art Barre: A Collection of the East End's Finest Arts" on November 5, 2016 at 7 p.m.. the first in a series of four "Art Barre" events.

The "Art Barre" programs include wine tasting, gallery viewing and music and dance performances. Starting off with a complimentary glass of wine from Martha Clara Vineyards, attendees will be able to view art by a featured East End Arts member artist while listening to live music by an East End Arts featured musician. The inaugural program on November 5 will feature the photography of <u>Jim Slezak</u> and Brett Callagy playing the viola.

The gallery visit will be followed by a dance performance by the Peconic Ballet Theatre company at the group's theater space down the street. East End Arts student musicians will accompany the professional dancers, with choreography by PBT's Christiana Bitonti.

The series will continue on November 19, with art by <u>Mary Twomey</u> and music by Brett Callagy; December 3, with photographs by <u>Helen Janson</u> and a cello performance by Aidan Saltini; and December 17, with paintings by Laura Stroh and music by Saltini.
