Take 2 Documentary Film Festival

The <u>Hamptons Take 2 Documentary Film Festival</u> will run from Thursday, December 1 through Sunday, December 4, 2016 at Bay Street Theater in Sag Harbor.

The four-day film festival, previewed by Hamptons Art Hub <u>here</u>, will showcase a multitude of documentaries, with topics ranging from Maya Angelou, to visual arts and artists, to Israeli cuisine, and more. There will also be two tributes: to mark the 30th anniversary of the PBS "American Masters" series on Friday, December 2; and to honor filmmaker Alex Gibney at the HT2FF annual gala on Saturday, December 3.

Tickets for each film are \$15, but \$13 for senior citizens. Tickets for the "American Masters" tribute and films on Friday are \$25, and admission to the Saturday night Gala is \$50. A full-festival pass is available for \$150.

A Christmas Carol, Live Radio Play

The Southampton Cultural Center will host multiple performances of the live radio play adaptation of "A Christmas Carol" on Friday, December 2 through Sunday, December 4, 2016.

Joe Landry's adaptation takes the Charles Dickens novella and turns it into a performance acted out

as if on a radio broadcast, with the performance relying on the actors changing their voices to play different characters, along with studio style sound effects. The classic Christmas tale tells the story of miserly Ebenezer Scrooge as he is visited by three spirits on Christmas Eve to teach him the meaning of the holiday and the spirit of generosity.

The 70-minute performances, directed by Michael Disher, will be at 7 p.m. on Friday, December 2, at 2 p.m., 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. on Saturday, December 3 and at 2 p.m. and 5 p.m. on Sunday, December 4.

Tickets are \$20 for adults and \$10 for students under 21.

Watermill Center's Final Open Studios of 2016

The Watermill Center will be hosting its final open studios of 2016 on Saturday, December 3, 2016 with current artists-in-residence, designer Zach Eugene Salinger-Simonson and performance group Undisciplined Body.

The open studio tours will begin at 2 p.m. with a look at the work of Zach Eugene Salinger-Simonson, followed by a visit with the members of Undisciplined Body at 3 p.m.

Zach Eugene Salinger-Simonson is an American industrial designer who has been focusing on the final stages of developing a jewelry collection during his residency. With his collection, he is critically interpreting the objects of the ring, collar, necklace and bracelet, along with writing a narrative from the perspective of the object.

Undisciplined Body, an interdisciplinary performance group, is currently developing "The Factory," in which they explore Foucault's biopolitical theory, focusing primarily on corporal discipline.

Undisciplined Body is a Chilean group that was co-founded by Ébana Garín and Camila Karl in 2012, according to the Watermill Center's <u>website</u>.

The artists, who began their residences on November 16, will be developing their work at the Watermill Center until the end of their residency on December 14, 2016.
