1. CITIZEN at BAM

BAM presents the NY Premiere of "CITIZEN" from **Wednesday**, **December 14 to Saturday**, **December 17**, **2016 at 7:30 p.m.** Performances will be held at the BAM Harvey Theater.

Choreographer Reggie Wilson's postmodern work draws from the languages of the African diaspora, weaving elements of blues, slave, and spiritual cultures into contemporary and pedestrian movement vocabularies. Along with with Fist & Heel Performance Group, Wilson presents a new work inspired by African-American figures throughout history who were conflicted and chose not to leave their home country in spite of pervasive racism. Five dancers engage with video projections in a series of solos that overlap and intersect, questioning the meaning of "belonging." This performance is part of 2016 Next Wave Festival and commissioned by BAM.

5. Simone Forti Performance at ISCP

The International Studio & Curatorial Program presents "Simone Forti Performance: Sleep Walkers / Zoo Mantras" on **Tuesday**, **December 20**, **2016 at 6:30 p.m.** The performance will be followed by a conversation between Simone Forti and curator Kari Conte.

In conjunction with ISCP's exhibition "The Animal Mirror," Simone Forti will mark the 50th anniversary of her seminal work "Sleep Walkers / Zoo Mantras" with its first performance in New York since the 1970s. Forti first performed the piece under the title "Zoo Mantras" in a 1968 solo event at Galleria L'Attico in Rome after spending days observing animals in the Rome Zoo. The choreography is based on the zoo animals' habitual movements and wrestles with the complexity of humans' intuitive identification with animal life.
