"4000 Miles" at Hampton Theatre Company

The Hampton Theatre Company presents "4000 Miles" by Amy Herzog from January 12 to January 29, 2017 at the Quogue Community Center. Performances will be held Thursdays and Fridays at 7 p.m., Saturdays at 8 p.m. and Sundays at 2:30 p.m. An additional Matinee will be held on Saturday, January 28 at 2:30 p.m.

"4000 Miles," Amy Herzog's comic drama won the Obie Award for Best New American Play and was a finalist for the 2013 Pulitzer Prize. The play depicts the unlikely relationship between a 91-year-old lefty and the young lefty grandson who unexpectedly shows up at her apartment at 3 a.m. after a life-altering cross-country bike ride. As an awkward overnight visit turns into weeks, these unlikely roommates infuriate, bewilder, and ultimately reach each other. "4000 Miles" looks at how two outsiders find their way in today's world.
