Documentary Screening of “EVA HESSE” at Southampton Arts Center

The Southampton Arts Center presents a screening of the documentary “EVE HESSE (2016)” on **Friday, February 24, 2017 at 7 p.m.**

Artist Eva Hesse, a 34 year-old German-born American, had a swiftly rising career that was tragically cut short when she died in May 1970. In this film, artists speak about Eva’s work, her life and the sixties. Sir Nicholas Serota, Director of the Tate Museums, and Whitney curator Elisabeth Sussman have also added their views on Hesse’s work and legacy in the documentary. With dozens of new interviews, footage of Hesse’s artwork and newly discovered archival imagery, “Eva Hesse” not only traces the artist’s path but also engages in an investigation into the creative community of 1960’s New York and Germany.

Hamptons International Film Festival and Guild Hall presents the screening of “To Kill a Mocking Bird” on **Saturday, February 25, 2017 at 7 p.m.** The screening will be held at Guild Hall.

In 1960, an unknown airline reservation agent published her first novel. That book, “To Kill A Mockingbird,” would go on to win the Pulitzer Prize. Two years later, Pulitzer Prize winning playwright Horton Foote adapted Lee’s novel for the screen and would eventually win the Oscar for his work, one of the film’s three Academy Awards. Featuring a career defining turn by Gregory Peck, the film captures Lee’s deft exploration of race & class relations, gender roles, and a child’s loss of innocence. Join Guild Hall Board President & HIFF Co-Chairman Alec Baldwin and HIFF Artistic Director David Nugent for this latest entry in the long running Winter Classic series with an extended discussion of the film to follow.
