**Hamptons Art Hub is issuing a Call for Art with the theme “In Motion.” Artwork Submissions are open for Fine Art and Fine Art Photography.**

**The competition is juried by Cheryl Hazan of Cheryl Hazan Gallery in New York City.**

**Submissions are now accepted online through April 9, 2017.**

**Artists can be based anywhere in the world. The Call for Art is NOT restricted to artists working in The Hamptons.**

**Artists are encouraged to interpret the theme liberally to portray land, water, people and culture in motion. Images capturing art itself in motion is encouraged.**

Hamptons Art Hub announces its second spring Call for Art Competition in support of the theme “In Motion.” The world is in motion in brand new ways, joining movement found in individuals, nature, art genres, journeys of the heart as well as physical and psychological adventures.

Artists are encouraged to interpret the theme as they wish with connections through composition, material, theme, inspiration or subject. Submissions are now open and will be accepted online through April 9, 2017. Artists can be based anywhere in the world. **The Call for Art is NOT restricted to artists working in The Hamptons.**

One art work will be selected as the Best Overall Artwork winner for the Call for Art Competition. First Place winners will be selected in the categories of Fine Art and Fine Art Photography. Honorable Mentions may be awarded based on the judge’s discretion. Selected art works will be presented in a juried online-only exhibition at Hamptons Art Hub that opens the week of April 23, 2017.

**Winners of Best Overall Artwork and Best in Fine Art and Best in Fine Art Photography win a cash prize and a free Artist Directory Membership to showcase their art for one (1) year.**

**Hamptons Art Hub's Call for Art Competition will be judged by New York City gallerist Cheryl Hazan of Cheryl Hazan Gallery, located in the Tribeca neighborhood in New York City.**

Cheryl Hazan opened her first gallery in Tribeca in 2000. She has consistently exhibited large-scale abstract contemporary paintings throughout her career, making the most of the spacious scale of her unique New York venue. Many of her represented artists are emerging to mid-career artists, who have been placed in important collections and exhibited in museum shows.
