### "Promises, Promises," a Center Stage Play, Performed at Southampton Cultural Center

Southampton Cultural Center presents "Promises, Promises" from March 9 - 26, 2017. Performances take place on Thursdays at 7:30 p.m., Fridays and Saturdays at 8 p.m. and on Sundays at 2:30 p.m.

The production, presented in a staged concert format, stars Darren Ottati and Shannon DuPuis. The story centers around Chuck Baxter, an average man with one valuable asset – his apartment. If he shares his apartment with the executives in his firm for their "extracurricular activities," it could mean promotion. "Promises, Promises" is written by Neil Simon, Burt Bachrach and Hal David. The comedic piece is directed by Michael Disher and complemented by an infectious score directed by Amanda Jones. Songs include "I Say a Little Prayer," "I'll Never Fall in Love Again," and "Promises, Promises."

#### Jazz Drummer William Hooker Performs to Silent Film

Southampton Arts Center presents a screening of "The Penalty" with musical accompaniment by Alternative jazz great William Hooker on **Saturday, March 11, 2017 at 7 p.m**.

"The Penalty," a 1920s silent film directed by Wallace Worsley, will be accompanied by live avantgarde solo drumming by the innovative <u>William Hooker</u>. William Hooker (drummer, composer and poet) has created works that range from jazz and "new" music to experimental genres. He has released over 60 CDs as a band leader.

As a musician, Hooker has performed at Brooklyn Academy of Music, The Atrium at Lincoln Center, Wadsworth Atheneum, Queen Elizabeth Hall, Walker Art Center, MTV, The Kitchen, Roulette, Real Art Ways and numerous jazz festivals including JVC Jazz Festival, Montreal Jazz Festival, Vancouver Jazz Festival and others.

## "See You In the Streets" Book Discussion at Montauk Library

The Montauk Library presents a Book Presentation & Discussion with Ruth Sergel on **Sunday, March 12 from 3:30 to 5 p.m.** 

Author and artist <u>Ruth Sergel</u> discusses her new book, See You In the Streets. The book offers a unique perspective on an art practice bridging art and technology to create works that promote individual and social transformation. The book centers around Sergel's Remember the Triangle Fire Coalition and a public participatory project where names of the 146 workers who perished in the 1911 Triangle Shirtwaist Factory fire are written in chalk in front of their former NYC homes to commemorate the anniversary.

Ruth Sergel's art has been exhibited at the Museum of Modern Art, Boston Museum of Fine Art, Corcoran Gallery of Art and many other prominent museums and galleries in the USA and abroad.
