



# Long Island Museum Look - March 2017

As Spring draws nearer, museums across Long Island offer plenty for art and history enthusiasts to enjoy. Be sure to catch the end of an exhibition of political cartoons and a show of photographs by Danny Lyon at Hofstra University Museum. A highlight opening this month is a retrospective of fashion designer Halston's work at Nassau County Museum of Art. Read on for new and continuing exhibitions in Long Island Museums throughout March 2017.

## DAN FLAVIN ART INSTITUTE - BRIDGEHAMPTON, NY

**"DAN FLAVIN: ICONS"** continues through April 30, 2017. The five wall-mounted "icons" on view in the exhibition bridge the mediums of painting and sculpture. The box-like constructions with painted surfaces and attached light fixtures were created between 1961 and 1964.

**ON PERMANENT VIEW** is an installation by [Dan Flavin](#) (1933-1996) of nine works in fluorescent light made between 1963 and 1981. The exhibition follows Flavin's art practice from when he began to work solely with standard fluorescent fixtures and tubes to just before the presentation of his new art form was realized.

## HECKSCHER MUSEUM OF ART - HUNTINGTON, NY

**"MORT KUNSTLER: THE NEW NATION"** continues through April 2, 2017. This exhibition features [Mort Künstler](#)'s most recent paintings that depict the story of our country's birth from settlement through the Revolutionary War and the inauguration of George Washington. This exhibition is closed from February 27 - March 10, 2017.

The exhibition features works by masters from the Golden Age of American Illustration. Artists on view include Edwin Austin Abbey, Howard Chandler Christy, Dean Cornwell, Charles Dana Gibson, Winslow Homer, J.C. Leyendecker, Maxfield Parrish, Howard Pyle, Norman Rockwell, and N.C. Wyeth, among others.

**“POLITICAL SLANT II: EDITORIAL CARTOONS”** continues through March 12, 2017. This exhibition features works by caricaturist and cartoonist [Thomas Nast](#) for historical context along with works by award-winning editorial cartoonists [Matt Davies](#), [Walt Handelsman](#), [Mike Keefe](#), [Steve Kelley](#), and [Signe Wilkinson](#) that offer commentary on our current national election process, candidates, and key issues.

**“DANNY LYON: MEMORIES OF THE SOUTHERN CIVIL RIGHTS MOVEMENT”** continues through April 13, 2017. The exhibition features photographs by [Danny Lyon](#), taken from 1962 to 1964 while traveling across the country documenting the Civil Rights Movement.

A special reception and closing performance, “The Art of Song,” by Jack Lacitra and Friends will take place on May 20 at 7 p.m. The unique music experience will feature musicians playing in each gallery, culminating in a collaborative performance in the Ballroom. A donation of \$10 will be collected at the door.

The exhibition will also feature interactive sound architecture that inspires the way we use music

and creativity in our daily environments. Exhibiting artists are Darlene Charneco, Heejung Cho, Corydon Cowansage, Linda Ganjian, Linda Louis, Maria Sophia Macedonio, Clayton Orehek, Jack Licitra and Danny Tanzi.

**“ELEMENTAL EXPOSURE: THE PHOTOGRAPHY OF SCOTT FARRELL”** continues through March 12, 2017. An after-hours event and Reception takes place on January 28 from 7 to 11 p.m. Scott Farrell’s photographic works are created by capturing organic materials and how the effects of nature’s elements such as water, wind, and extreme temperatures transform these materials.

**“EDIBLE EDEN: THE ART OF LONG ISLAND’S FORESTS, FIELDS AND WATERS”** continues through July 30, 2017. The exhibition features works by artists depicting Long Island in the nineteenth century. These works focus on the bounty of Long Island’s natural resources and farmlands.

**“BRILLIANT PARTNERS: JUDITH LEIBER’S HANDBAGS & THE ART OF GERSON LEIBER”** continues through June 4, 2017. ## SUFFOLK COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY - RIVERHEAD, NY

**“100 YEARS: VOTES FOR NEW YORK WOMEN”** opens March 11, 2017 and continues through the end of the year. This exhibition celebrates the centennial of New York State women winning the right to vote with stories of Long Island women activists who dedicated themselves to the grassroots movement.

**“A TIME PORTAL TO THE NORTH FORK: PHOTOGRAPHS OF RIVERHEAD TO ORIENT POINT”** continues through March 31, 2017. The exhibition features documentary and fine art

photography depicting the North Fork by local photographers Neil Scholl, Peter Dicke and Wendy Polhemus-Annibell in the Weathervane Gallery. The Suffolk County Historical Society is located at 300 W. Permanent exhibitions include “So Ends This Long Journey”, “Early Suffolk Farm Life and The Rise of Crafts”, “Early Suffolk Transport”, “From Near and Far: Ceramics in Suffolk County Households, 1750-1870” and “Arms & Armament”.
