“The Female of the Species,” performed at North Fork Community Theatre

North Fork Community Theatre presents “The Female of the Species, A Comedy” from **March 17 through April 2, 2017**. Performances are set for March 17, 18, 19, 24, 25, 26, 31, April 1 and 2. All shows are at 8 p.m., except for March 19 and 26 with matinees at 2:30 p.m. On Friday, March 17 a free pre-show reception will be held at 7 p.m.

Directed by Bob Kaplan and produced by Babette Cornine, this comedy is about how women were affected, their daughters bore the brunt of and men were confused by the feminine revolution. The play is presented through special arrangement with Australian Script Centre.

This program will begin with a short talk about the Perfect Earth Project’s installation in “[A Sense of Place,](#)” and then Edwina von Gal will present special signs to representatives of the PRFCT toxin-free public places. Guests can view the works in galleries and enjoy light refreshments.

The program will conclude with a Bee House Workshop – including craft activity targeted to parents and children, using recycled and natural materials to make native Bee Hotels, educating attendees on the importance of native pollinator populations and how they can protect them.

Southampton Cultural Center presents “Promises, Promises” through March 26, 2017. Performances take place on Thursdays at 7:30 p.m., Fridays and Saturdays at 8 p.m. and on Sundays at 2:30 p.m.

The production, presented in a staged concert format, stars Darren Ottati and Shannon DuPuis. The story centers around Chuck Baxter, an average man with one valuable asset – his apartment. If he shares his apartment with the executives in his firm for their “extracurricular activities,” it could mean promotion. “Promises, Promises” is written by Neil Simon, Burt Bachrach and Hal David. The comedic piece is directed by Michael Disher and complemented by an infectious score directed by Amanda Jones. Songs include “I Say a Little Prayer,” “I’ll Never Fall in Love Again,” and “Promises, Promises.”

Director [Steven Soderbergh](#) turns the camera on monologist [Spalding Gray](#) to explore the story of Gray's diagnosis of a rare ocular condition. Terrified of the prospect of an invasive surgery, Gray launched into an investigation into unusual alternative cures. The engaging and often funny work combines the telling of Gray's experience with interviews with people from all walks of life that have experienced similarly bizarre eye conditions.
