Alice Neel Film Screening

The Kitchen presents "Michel Auder: A Portrait of Alice Neel" on **Monday, April 3, 2017 at 7 p.m.** Visit <u>David Zwirner</u> at 525 & 533 West 19th Street for a private viewing of the exhibition <u>"Alice Neel: Uptown"</u> from **5 to 6:30 p.m.**

"Portrait of Alice Neel, 1976-1982" is an intimate record of the artist by the Brooklyn-based filmmaker Michel Auder. The two became friends in 1975 when Neel (1900-1984) was living on the Upper West Side, just south of Harlem. Drawing on extensive footage he shot of Neel over the course of their five-year friendship—at home, while painting, on vacation, and in public—Auder's film is a document of the artist's life. Following its initial release in 1986, a longer version of the film was produced in 1999 with funding from the Philadelphia Museum of Art. The screening follows an introduction by the writer and critic Hilton Als, who curated the exhibition "Alice Neel, Uptown" at David Zwirner.

"Good Mud" is a dance by Lily Gold, in collaboration with the performers Asli Bulbul, Eleanor Hullihan, Madison Krekel, and Alice MacDonald. Sound design is by James Jolliff and Lily Gold and lighting design is by Elliott Jenetopulos.

Hannah Black Performance at MoMA PS1

MoMA PS1 presents "Hannah Black, OR LIFE OR" on Sunday, April 9, 2017 at 3 p.m.

This new performance by Hannah Black is part of an ongoing collaboration with the musician Bonaventure and the designer <u>Ebba Fransén Waldhör</u>. Their 2016 performance at the <u>Institute of Contemporary Arts</u> in London, titled "Anxietina," introduced a superhero figure who channels her anxiety into small acts of creation and destruction. The <u>VW Sunday Sessions</u> commission presents an expanded iteration of this character, with Anxietina setting off on an adventure loosely based on the Wikipedia entry for "life," the field of corporate catastrophic risk analysis, and colonial American antiques.

"Fragmented Frida" Performed at BAM

BAM and Gypsy Dahlia Productions presents "Fragmented Frida" from **April 11 through April 16, 2017**. Performances will be held April 11 through April 14 at 8 p.m., on April 15 at 2 p.m. and 8 p.m. and on April 16 at 2 p.m. and 6 p.m.

"Fragmented Frida" is by Andrea Dantas and directed by Jim Parrack and Christine Renee Miller. After facing an episode of bullying due to her Jewish heritage, a crippled young Frida Kahlo is determined to prove that she is not a nobody, but a tragic accident and a heartbreaking betrayal leave her in shambles. Shattered and alone, she has no choice but to paint. "Fragmented Frida" is a one-woman show in two acts that traces the journey of Mexican painter Frida Kahlo.

The Metropolitan Museum of Art presents "Towering Above Maine: David Salle on Marsden Hartley" on **Tuesday, April 18, 2017 at 6:30 p.m.** The talk will be held in the Grace Rainey Rogers Auditorium.

The American modernist Marsden Hartley's art exudes an irrepressible emotional force that continues to inspire artists, among them painter, printmaker and writer David Salle, whose own work has helped define postmodernism. Salle joins Randall Griffey, co-curator of "Marsden Hartley's Maine," on view at The Met Breuer through June 18, 2017, to explore Hartley's imagery and its appeal to other artists.

In celebration of <u>A.K. Burns</u>' "Leave No Trace," (2016), this record release party includes performances and readings by artists and writers including Justin Allen, Fia Backström, CAConrad, Katherine Hubbard, and Juliana Huxtable. "Leave No Trace" is an experimental audio project released as a limited edition vinyl with an accompanying poem. The recording consists of two full-length LP tracks that combine ambient environmental recordings, vocalization, sounds generated from various materials, and an old electric guitar.
